PRESENTACIÓN Y CONTEXTUALIZACIÓN

"English for Law" enables participants to improve their command of legal English.

"English for Law" aims to: (1) improve students' skills in reading and understanding legal texts or texts on legal issues; (ii) strengthen their knowledge and command of the features of legal English; (iii) activate and expand their legal vocabulary and (iv) improve their grammar skills (in particular grammar issues specific to legal English).

Students will practise legal English skills, ranging from legal reading or vocabulary building to writing (in the assignments), among others.

REQUISITOS Y/O RECOMENDACIONES PARA CURSAR ESTA ASIGNATURA

Students are expected to have at the very least a B1+/C2 level of English (CEFR, Common European Framework of Reference for Languages).

The specific difficulties and intricate nature of the grammar of legal English requires students to have a good command of English, since they will have to learn features typical of a very advanced/proficient user of English such as the subjunctive, inversion, archaisms, noun compounds, subordination, etc.

Students must consult the online course regularly to be informed of deadlines, notices, etc.

METODOLOGÍA

The distance learning methodology at UNED offers, among other things, flexibility for students to organise their time, which means that they can study the materials at a time that suits them best within the duration of the course.
